This Challenge is designed to help you establish "National Prominence" by charting our own course for Fraternity and Sorority Life at Marshall University. This is your opportunity to take responsibility for planning the future, addressing community issues, renewing fraternal spirit & commitment, and learning the leadership skills necessary to accomplish these goals.

The curriculum is designed to foster improved relationships among fraternity/sorority members through an intensive, interactive, two and one half day program. The program emphasizes problem solving, leadership development, value-based decision making, effective communication and community development.

All participants are expected to be active learners and teachers throughout the program. Through large group sessions, complimented by small group discussions, each participant will have the opportunity to personalize their own experience. All sessions offer hands-on experimental activities and ample discussion time to address individual concerns.
