It should be placed under "The spring semester includes the following courses" -Remove SWK Electives (3-6 credit hours) as they are no longer required for Advanced Standing. - Remove SWK 674 Drugs in Society pg 154 -course was never created and is not listed in course pg 312.-Remove section "Behavioral Health Electives" on page 154.




The proposed DNP program is a natural extension of the Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) FNP program at Marshall. There are no DNP programs in the southeastern portion of the state of WV. Presently nurses must seek to receive DNP from West Virginia University (WVU) or Sheppard University, or go out of state to obtain the DNP. The addition of the DNP program at Marshall will provide advance practice nurses in WV the opportunity to earn a professional doctorate and will increase enrollment at Marshall.
