Volunteers from the station and WFGH-FM, in Fort Gay, WV, partnered to originate the program and send it to affiliates across the Mountain State. Eventually the program took on a life of its own in the W. Page Pitt School of Journalism and Mass Communication's high-definition television studio.

"Originally, we didn't consider doing the program for television or video streaming," Rogers said. "We viewed it solely as a radio program, but then a plan emerged that would work without changing the entire format of the program. It's still very much a radio program at its heart, but we've received a lot of compliments about the video stream." Reports on web access to Basketball Friday Night in West Virginia indicate the program has reached listeners in all 50 states.

WMUL-FM's staff is entirely comprised of students and local community volunteers, who DJ, write and produce news and sports reports and producing original promotional and public service announcements. "Without our dedicated staff we wouldn't be able to do half the programming we currently do," Rogers said. "Our student and community volunteers are the lifeblood to what we do here every year. From writing and producing our daily Newscenter 88 newscasts and covering various events on campus to calling Marshall Athletic events and attending recruitment meetings, our staff spends countless hours working to provide a great product for our listening audience."

WMUL-FM has won over 1,500 awards since 1985 in local, state and national competitions, while competing against both student and professional broadcasters. Public radio's purpose is to serve the public to which it broadcasts.

Approaching its 55<sup>th</sup> anniversary, WMUL-FM has been providing the Huntington-Tri-State community with "cutting edge" music and a menu of original news, sports and public affairs programming as well as nationally syndicated public affairs programming since becoming the first non-commercial radio station in West Virginia. It began as a 10-watt station on November 1, 1961 that was barely picked up on campus, but now it broadcasts to the Tri-State area with a 1,500-watt antenna and streams all of its programming online.

WMUL–FM operates out of the W. Page Pitt School of Journalism and Mass Communications and broadcasts 24/7/365. The award winning tradition of Marshall University's campus radio station is well established, but a deeper look will reveal why these students are bringing home the trophies.

"We love the variety of music we play because it's different from the commercial alternatives in the area, but we take a lot of pride in the quality of our original programming as well," Adam Rogers, WMUL-FM Executive Director said. "Newscenter 88 at 5 p.m. runs Monday through Friday and covers the entire Tri-State, not just the Marshall and Huntington communities." The news stories are generated, reported, edited and announced by Marshall University students.

"Our public affairs programming is one of the most important things we do," Rogers said. "It's our responsibility to let our listeners know what issues are taking place in their neighborhoods and city." People can read about those issues in a newspaper or online, but there's just something about hearing it straight from the source's mouth without a middleman."

In addition to original public affairs programming, WMUL-FM also broadcasts three nationally syndicated public affairs programs. Making Contact airs at 5:30 p.m. on Mondays and covers issues from the environment and women's issues to racial justice and reproductive health and justice. It is a weekly award-winning magazine/documentary-style program produced by the National Radio Project based in Oakland, CA that features voices not generally heard in other venues.

The Bioneers and New World Notes air back-to-back at 9 a.m. on Fridays. The Bioneers, produced by Collective Heritage Institute/Bioneers, focuses on environmental and social justice and innovative solutions to issues of the planet and its people. New World Notes examines political and social issues from a progressive prospective and with humor.

"The FM 88 Sports team broadcasts Marshall football, men's and women's basketball and soccer, volleyball, baseball and softball games and every Wednesday evening from 6-10 p.m. is dedicated to sports-talk programming," Rogers said.

"Basketball Friday Night in West Virginia," an innovative venture of WMUL-FM, has proven highly successful. The station began its first simulcasting effort two years ago with the program that reports on both boys and girls high school basketball across all levels in West Virginia with the help of callers and social media.

# FIVE BEING INDUCTED INTO THE MARSHALL SCHOOL OF JOURNALISM AND MASS COMMUNICATIONS HALL OF FAME

HUNTINGTON – Five graduates of Marshall University's W. Page Pitt School of Journalism and Mass Communications (SOJMC) are being inducted into the school's Hall of Fame this fall.

Dr. Charles Bailey, Mike Cherry, Jody Jividen, Chad Pennington and Peter Ruest officially will be inducted during a Sept. 23 ceremony.

"The five alumni being honored each have left their own unique marks on mass communications," said Chris Dickerson, president of the SOJMC Alumni Advisory Council which handled the nomination process. "They all are quite deserving of this honor."

Bailey is a 1974 SOJMC bachelor's graduate and a 1985 master's graduate. He is a professor in the SOJMC and faculty manager of WMUL-FM. Under his guidance, the radio station and its student broadcasters have won nearly 1,600 awards since 1985. He is a member of the West Virginia Broadcasting Hall of Fame and has been given the Lifetime Achievement Award from the West Virginia Associated Press Broadcasters Association.

Cherry is a 1980 SOJMC graduate. He was an award-winning sportswriter who worked for the Charleston Gazette, Charleston Daily Mail, Charleston and for Florida Today. For most of his career in West Virginia, he covered Marshall and West Virginia University sports. He also worked in the Marshall University Athletic Department after graduation and later freelanced for The Sporting News. He died of cancer in 2010 at the age of 54.

Jividen is a 1981 SOJMC graduate. He was an award-winning sportswriter for the Charleston Daily Mail. He covered everything from high school sports to Marshall and West Virginia University athletics to the 1996 Summer Olympics. He later became sports editor and city editor of the paper. He died of cancer in 2002 at the age of 44.

Pennington is a 2000 SOJMC graduate. He is best known as a standout quarterback for the Marshall Thundering Herd and for his time in the NFL with the New York Jets and Miami



W. Page Pitt School of Journalism and Mass Communications Dolphins. But the Rhodes Scholar is an SOJMC graduate who spent a season as an NFL analyst for Fox Sports. He also has helped the university raise millions of dollars through the Vision Campaign for Athletics, and he has helped the Tri-State Area through his 1st and 10 Foundation.

Ruest is a 1997 SOJMC graduate. He currently is Vice President and Account Director at Energy BBDO, a leading advertising and marketing company. He previously worked at Young & Rubicam as well as Wieden + Kennedy. He has worked on campaigns for Wrigley, Sears, Nike and many others.

Inductees must be a graduate of the SOJMC program, but there are two other criteria to be nominated:

- \* Contribution(s) to Journalism and Mass Communications as a profession. The nominee has made a contribution to the profession of journalism or has made a positive impact upon the profession.
- \* Contribution(s) to Marshall University and/or the SOJMC. The nominee, either through talent, treasure or activity, has made an outstanding impact upon Marshall University and/or the SOJMC Department.

Course description (official): Students report, shoot, edit, write, produce, and anchor MU Report. a student-produced newscast. The class makes use of university broadcast facilities and West Virginia Public Television, as available. Graduate students assume managerial responsibilities in addition to content creation, and also write an academic paper on an issue relevant to the current state of television news, such as ratings and profits, bleed and lead television coverage, budget cuts and investigation, etc.

Course description (unofficial): This class is an examination of and practice in news for television. It is an intro course to broadcast journalism for TV news, including reporting, writing, videography, editing, scripting, producing, and performance. The student will make extensive use of university equipment and facilities, including the statewide public television system where the student's material will air.

**Text**: While there is no formal text for this course, the student should get, consult, and hold on to *Media Writers Handbook*, Dr. George Arnold, and the *Associated Press Style Manual*.

**SOJMC and the student**: The student will use university equipment to shoot and edit packages and stories for this course, but each student will need to BUY a separate portable hard drive AND a 10 speed or higher 32 gig or higher SD card for camera work.

**Graduate students:** Graduate students will assume additional duties such as story manager/assignment editor, news producer/backtiming, and production components consistent with the programming mission of MU Report.

Course objectives: Students will gain very practical experience in television story building and producing newscasts for air. The class starts by getting away from the level of detail associated with print storytelling, and moves quickly to the mechanics of the video camera. The student will also learn about shorter interviews and shorter time in the field shooting. The student will acquire the skills needed to be a video storyteller. In the edit booth, students will learn how to record a script (which the student has written and the producer has cleaned), and edit clips for a package. Most students will also anchor, but that is *not* the primary emphasis of the course.

Even though the class is not about the grade but about story development

By course's end, to pass:

- Gather and write accurate, organized, grammatically correct broadcast reports, SEVEN packages which air in some venue.
- Capture, store, and manipulate audio and video to create the above reports for air.
- Work as a group to produce and anchor the WVPBS newscast and Up top the Minute.

**Topical objectives/learning outcomes:** Students will, by course conclusion,

- Better understand matters of a free press by participating in free press expression
- Appreciate the practical theories that underpin video and audio construction
- Write television news copy rather than copy for other media
- Research and evaluate information for inclusion or exclusion in news stories

- Contemplate their own work according to standards of truth, accuracy and fairness
- Bring together various "threads" of a story to create a cogent whole
- Grasp the value of ethical conduct
- Gather news by thinking critically, creatively, and independently
- Incorporate marginalized voices and alternate views into story content
- Master the tools and technology required

How will the class work? The class begins with a short course in television single camera video production. JMC 301 news skills are expected as part of the class—with the added time constraints of short packages that get to the point. Stories are to come from Marshall or have a Marshall tie because the rest of the market is already covered by commercial television stations. The beat is Marshall, so cover it. The repetition is meant to improve performance.

What's the WVPBS thing? Six times a semester the student must move to the studio for the recording (live to tape) of a statewide 14:30 broadcast. If the average package runs 1:30 on tape, and the anchor material around it runs another :30, that's up to 8 packages, along with readers, vos, vosots, intros, and outros. The producer, along with the director and the instructor's help, will count down the broadcast to close about once every two weeks starting in September. Dates to be announced. Marshall's MU Report rotates with WVU and two other West Virginia schools, which is terrific student exposure.

**Story Time References**: Stories must be, by definition, evergreen on tape. That is, they CANNOT make a reference to time/date/time stamp for air. This is because the telecast is often sent 10 days before air, not including the time that has passed before recording. Be mindful of this in everything recorded.

**Up To the Minute**. Deadline is everything in this business. To get better accustomed to deadline, the class will begin production of a 4-MINUTE newscast for air on Ch. 25 (Cabell County cable only) before midterm. This occurs outside class time but for course credit. The same stories that run in the short show will also run in MU Report, the formal name of the WVPBS program. One anchor is required for Up to the Minute. This program is contingent on a director and a crew.

General comments: This class should be the most time-consuming, yet rewarding class in the student's schedule. While the student will be free of the constraints of tests and memorization, the expectation is so much higher that a comparison is foolish. TV News students must breathe news, grab a camera, go, and bring it back. It is their one and only chance to decide if this is the career for them, and then practice for it.

Attendance: Students are here because they think they want to do this or explore it. Missing two classes unexcused does not result in a penalty, as long as it is not a record day. Missing a third class unexcused results in a letter grade drop of the final grade. Missing four unexcused means the student can earn no higher than a C in the course. Missing five will result in failure. I also reserve the right to fire students for failing to turn in work because this class is more of a newsroom than a course. If a student misses two deadlines, s/he will be asked to withdraw from the course. Failure to withdraw will mean a loss of professionalism points and a failing grade for the course. On the other hand, excused absences must be confirmed in advance, and the material for what constitutes an excused absence can be found from Marshall's webpage. Show tapings and package deadlines cannot be made up.

**Grading**: 7 packages at 50 each across the term. Two practical, hands on exams worth 25 each, 4-5 topical assignments to include video sequencing, editing, script generation, voice exercises, and for graduate students, producing, story generation, and related. All students will have the chance to anchor a newscast, but anchoring is not the focus of the course. SEVEN IS THE MINIMUM, with 4 completed weekly by midterm and returned graded. The remaining 3 cannot be turned in the last week of class, either.

The last package for a SEVEN minimum grade is THE LAST BIG SHOW. Extras can be used to substitute for lower grades and for daily shows. Anything other than the aforementioned order, or fewer than seven stories, fails.

Packages are worth 50 points each AND MUST INCLUDE A VOSOT after training. The student earns the grade on a 93-100 scale by completing the seven packages THEN TURNING THEM IN FOR A GRADE ALONG WITH A LEAD, TAG, SCRIPT AND SUPERS BEFORE the broadcast. Producers may substitute one package grade for producing. Photographers must shoot TWO other COMPLETE pieces for 1 package credit. The photographer must submit the completed story before air, then do it again, to earn the grade.

The instructor also reserves 25 professionalism points. Those who come to class, make progress (from whatever level), and express the correct esprit de corps keep the points. Conduct the news director deems unprofessional costs the points. These points can be lost for the following reasons, but the listed reasons are not delimiting.

- 1) An inappropriate attitude in or out of class
- 2) Rude or offensive conduct displayed toward the instructor, another student, or by far the worst, toward an interview subject for a story
- 3) Repeated delays in completing responsibilities
- 4) Any incident, behavior, or conduct which does not assist the group in completing the task
- 5) Regular tardiness or absence
- 6) Cell phone use to text or talk
- Excessive cursing

Up to the Minute is also worth points to be determined.

Other grades: The following is an explanation of the topical assignments
The news material is the real part of the grade. But, to that end, the
student will be doing other things worth various points along the way.
There will be at least 5 assignments/tests/voice exercises required. Here's
a rough idea.

 Words of the industry/Words of VIDEO NEWS—These are quasi tests, important, but not memorization. Points to be determined

- 2) Shoot. Points to be determined
- 3) Shoot and edit a sequence—This is a video command, edit command exercise. Very important.
- 4) Intonation variety exercise—This voice work comes from a variety of sources. Points to be determined
- 5) Script construction, editing, proofing exercise—This is how the student will make MU Report contributions stronger. Points to be determined
- 6) Delivery—a separate voice track for a grade.
- 7) Anchor practice (or alternative)

**Graduate academic paper:** The instructor is committed to offering graduate students a life-like television news experience in keeping with the SOJMC hands on tradition. But, graduate students must consider more than the pedestrian elements of news. To that end, graduate students in collaboration with the instructor, will write an appropriate length APA style paper on a topic sensitive to television news. The topics are as boundless as the student's imaginations and experiences.

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If students conduct themselves professionally, they will thrive. By the same token, the instructor promises to provide a professional, relatively harassment free environment. But, the instructor also reserves the right to model news director conduct in expecting students to think and perform. There will be no hurt feelings. If someone in the group is letting the group down, police them or the instructor will have to. Accept constructive criticism from a seasoned professional. If the student wants a second opinion, get it. But, the second critique is likely to be much more forceful. The most important objective of each piece of instruction is to help the student get a job. The instructor will not hesitate to offer constructive criticism to that end.

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### CAPSTONE REQUIREMENTS, ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS, EXPLANATIONS.

Packages alone will NOT be enough to complete the course largely because so many additional items are essential to TV success.

- 1) All students WILL upload individual packages to YouTube or receive an F on the assignment
- 2) All students WILL rotate to upload MU Report to YouTube and deploy links to MU Report's Facebook and Twitter accounts
- 3) One student WILL be designated as social media manager with a grade attached to maintain CONSTANT social media presence (to be explained)
- 4) All students WILL CORRECT/IMPROVE stories FOR COMPETITION, AND WILL BE REQUIRED TO RESEARCH AND ENTER COMPETITION. The school will pay for entries
- 5) One student WILL serve as contest coordinator for a grade

Note failure to complete the above requirements will result in failure, even though no points attach.

- Master the tools and technology required

How will the class work? The class begins with the expectation ALL kinks are worked out from the fall. This means a story cannot pass if it has any video/audio imperfection not corrected. Factual errors are a failing offense. Missing two deadlines is a failing offense. There are other failing offenses which are discussed and arise unfortunately organically and so are not subject to predetermined parameters. A failing offense is the equivalent of dismissal. Conduct not tolerated in a newsroom is not tolerated here.

THE STUDENT WILL PRODUCE 13 PACKAGES OR EQUIVALENT.

What's the WVPBS thing? Six times a semester the student must move to the studio for the recording (live to tape) of a statewide 14:30 broadcast. If the average package runs 1:30 on tape, and the anchor material around it runs another :30, that's up to 8 packages, along with readers, vos, vosots, intros, and outros. The producer, along with the director and the instructor's help, will count down the broadcast to close about once every two weeks starting in January. Dates to be announced. Marshall's MU Report rotates with WVU and two other West Virginia schools, which is terrific student exposure.

**Grading:** 13 packages at 50 each across the term and for graduate students, producing, story generation, and related. All students will have the chance to anchor a newscast, but anchoring is not the focus of the course. 13 IS THE MINIMUM, with half completed weekly by midterm and returned graded. The remaining cannot be turned in the last week of class, either. The last package for the course is for THE LAST BIG SHOW. Extras can be used to substitute for lower grades and for daily shows. Anything other than the aforementioned order, or fewer than seven stories, fails.

**Story Time References**: Stories must be, by definition, evergreen on tape. That is, they CANNOT make a reference to time/date/time stamp for air. This is because the telecast is often sent 10 days before air, not including the time that has passed before recording. Be mindful of this in everything recorded.

**Up To the Minute**. Deadline is everything in this business. To get better accustomed to deadline, the class will begin production of a 4-MINUTE newscast for air on Ch. 25 (Cabell County cable only) before midterm. This occurs outside class time but for course credit. The same stories that run in the short show will also run in MU Report, the formal name of the WVPBS program. One anchor is required for Up to the Minute.

**STREAMING.** Ideally, if student numbers permit, we will begin an alternate newscast with length and focus to be determined produced on alternate weeks from WVPBS.

CONTEST ENTRY—All students will submit to contest coordinator by deadlines on demand. This is not optional and will result in grade penalties.

General comments: This class should be the most time-consuming, yet rewarding class in the student's schedule. While the student will be free of the constraints of tests and memorization, the expectation is so much higher that a comparison is foolish. TV News students must breathe news, grab a camera, go, and bring it back. It is their one and only chance to decide if this is the career for them, and then practice for it.

A growing number of organizations are dependent on Business Intelligence (BI) and analytics in order to compete in the market place. To that end, this course presents information from business, as well as the behavioral and quantitative sciences, and addresses both theory and application. IMC tools and techniques as well as functional and personal competencies will be explored. Experiential learning portfolio exercises will convey and reinforce the concepts and tools covered.

Exams will include both objective and subjective types of questions. Students are expected to identify, define, integrate, and apply the terms and concepts covered in the articles, handouts, cases, assignments, portfolio exercises, and in class. Exams may be curved. A standard method of 10% increments is used for quizzes and course letter grade assignment. If a student misses an exam without a valid/documented excuse, he/she will receive a 0 on that exam.

The portfolio exercises (PE in the Schedule) will be completed in and outside of class and have two primary purposes. First, each is designed to make you think in-depth about the concept and its application and/or impact on both the consumer and the organization's marketing strategy. Second, the portfolio exercises will allow you to develop further your critical thinking, problem solving, and marketing communication skills. Some portfolio exercises will be completed individually, while others will be completed by pairs of students or teams. Portfolio exercises will be graded on content and structure. As with the exams, a standard method of 10% increments is used for grading purposes.

The project will involve critiquing a service business as to how it is implementing IMC. Findings and recommendations will be presented to the class. Students may work individually or in pairs. If working in a team of two, project section assignments will be coordinated with the professor in order to obtain assurance of learning information for the college. The service business to be critiqued must be approved by the professor prior to beginning the project. The written project deliverable will be in the form of PowerPoint slides with extensive notes. Other information regarding the project is provided at the end of this syllabus. Project oral presentations will be divided across multiple class meetings due to the large class enrollment. You are required to attend all presentations regardless of whether or not they are on the date of your own presentation.

Attendance is expected as is class participation. Both are necessary if you want to do well in the course. Exams will assess both written material and in-class discussions and activities, therefore, it is important to be here. In addition, portfolio exercises will be completed and/or discussed in class. Attendance will be taken periodically throughout the course. Please note, however, that attendance alone does not constitute full participation.

If a student in a borderline course grade situation has been present on 90% or more of those sessions in which attendance was taken and he/she has participated fully in all aspects of the class, his/her grade will be raised to the next letter grade.

### **COURSE METHOD**

The course reflects an integration of the class discussions, lectures, portfolio exercises, readings, videos, homework, and handouts.

#### **IMC for Professional Services Project Guidelines**

The goal of the project is to allow you to apply what you have learned this semester about integrated marketing communications (IMC) for professional services. To do that, you may 1) interview someone representing a professional service and discuss their organization's use of IMC, or 2) identify a professional service and review their use of IMC by researching secondary sources. <u>Do not simply</u> report, but rather, critique the organization's IMC activities and make recommendations.

Areas to include, whether you select to do an interview or to research secondary sources:

- 1. What is the business?
  - a. What is the service business and what specific services are provided?
  - b. Where are they located?
  - c. What are the target market characteristics (businesses and/or consumers, geographic, demographic, psychographic, benefits sought)?
- 2. What are they doing with IMC?
  - a. What are they doing with advertising?

Campaigns, appeals and execution techniques, successes, media, frequency, budget...

Do they use brochures, who creates them, budget, target markets ...

b. What are they doing with personal selling?

Who is primarily responsible, what avenues do individuals use, training, techniques...

c. What are they doing with public relations?

Who is primarily responsible, techniques, successes, failures, crisis management....

d. What's happening with their website?

What do you think of it, what do they think of it, who does it, how could it be improved..

- 3. What are they doing with other areas that support IMC?
  - a. Do they do anything regarding professionalism?

Training, workshops, mentoring, emails & letters...

b. What are they doing with relationship marketing and CRM?

Who is responsible? Do you agree with their CRM choice? What do you recommend?

Required procedures: In addition to the above instructions, 1) You must get your selected service business approved by me, and 2) present your completed project to the class in an oral presentation. You may choose to do your project alone or with a team. If you elect to do the project in a team, no more than two persons may be on the same project team. In the team setting, you must identify which slides were produced by each team member and each team member must present for a proportional amount of time during the class presentation.

**Required Deliverable**: PP slides with information details in the Notes for each slide. Provide enough information in the Notes so the PP presentation can stand on its own without a presenter.

Grading: PP slide notes will be graded on completion of all assignment elements, depth of critique and recommendations, grammar, typographical accuracy, and correct use of IMC terminology. Oral presentations will be graded on eye contact with the audience, preparation (don't read your notes or the PP slides), rate of speech, vocalized pauses, voice inflection, professional posture and movement, use of PP slides/screen, and volume. Peer evaluation will be a component of the grading in team projects. The written deliverable will account for 150 possible points and the oral presentation will account for 50 possible points.

**Due Date**: All PP slides are due at the beginning of the first day of class presentations regardless of the day you are presenting.
