Activities

- » Before Reading: Preview the book for words that may be unfamiliar to your child. Talk about these words and their meaning before you read the story.
- » During Reading: Ask your child questions to ensure they understand the story. If necessary, reread certain pages.
- » Times of Worry: Ask your child to think of a time when they felt worried. Discuss different things they can do to make them feel better when they are feeling worried or anxious.
- » Family Traditions: Ask your child to illustrate a picture of one of their favorite family traditions.
- » Yarn Creation: Provide your child with paper, yarn, and glue. Ask them to create a picture using these three materials.
- » Nature Walk: Take a walk outside and see if you can identify any objects that were found in the story. Take the book with you so you can refer to the illustrations!
