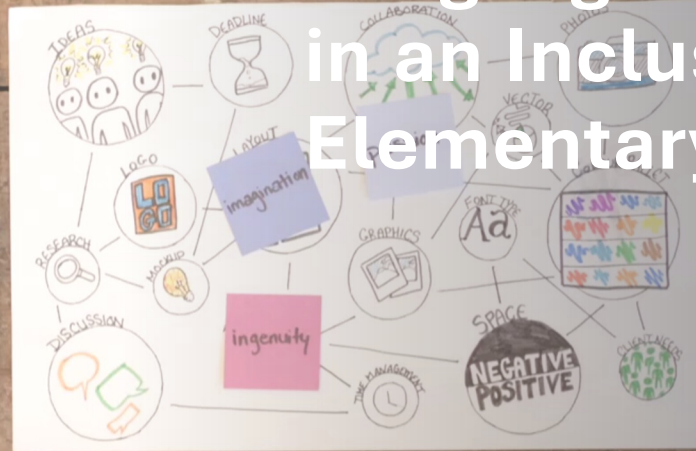

Collaboration and Teamwork

Sustainability and Impact
