Activities

- » Before Reading: Take a picture walk through the book and look at the illustrations pointing out the different items needed and used by builders.
- » During Reading: Talk about the different construction tools and equipment and model the noises they might make. Encourage your child to imitate you.
- » After Reading: Revisit the pages that describe what builders wear and point to and name the items again. Encourage your child to repeat the words and point to the pictures.
- » Sensory: Create a sensory experience using dirt and rocks. Collect construction toys for an interactive experience.
- » Pretend Play: Buy or make a builder's gear (hard hat, safety glasses, orange vest, boots etc.) Collect some large boxes for your little one to use as construction equipment.
- » Visit a Construction Site: Provide your child with the experience of seeing construction equipment and workers in action. Point out how each piece of equipment works and the noises they make.
