


THE PUDGY BOOK OF MOTHER GOOSE

Activities

- » Before Reading: Take a picture walk through the book and look at the colorful illustrations pointing out familiar objects and animals. Consider only reading one nursery rhyme per sitting.
- » During Reading: Read in a sing-song voice to help engage your little one.
- » After Reading: Recite the rhyme again but this time add hand motions to interact with your little one.
- » Sensory: Consider making a sensory bin for each of the rhymes to enhance the experience.
- » Finger Puppets: Finger puppets are fun and easy to make. Here are some ideas to get you started!
- » Rhyme Time: Add more rhymes to your collection. This <u>website</u> shares common nursery rhymes and a simple activity to do while you're singing.
