


Elementary Math Credentialing

Teachers enrolled in this program will participate in over 70 hours of in-person, practice-based professional learning focused on the elementary portion of the West Virginia College- and Career-Readiness for Mathematics standards and the Mathematical Habits of Mind. These standards are divided into 5 clusters requiring 12 days of interactive and collaborative workshops. These sessions provide sustained opportunities to learn, experience, and practice the evidence-based strategies modeled by elementary educators. Participants will be enveloped in a network of collaboration and support as they implement and reflect upon these practices.











Elementary Math Credentialing Benefits:

- Sustained feedback, coaching, and expert support specific to teachers' individual needs
- No cost to teachers for the entirety of the program
- Obtain a deeper understanding of mathematical processes
- Enhanced ability to diagnose and correct student misunderstanding
- Receive classroom manipulatives—and the training to implement them—that facilitate active learning
- Earn continuing education/graduate credits through Marshall University at a reduced rate.
- Impact student learning.

Portfolio:

Participants will develop a NBCT inspired portfolio with the support of trainers. This portfolio will allow teachers to document the evolution of their practice while also facilitating reflection and feedback.

Components:

- 12 video lessons aligned to the 12 professional learning sessions and standards
- Sample lesson plans that correspond with each video
- · Student work samples
- Student work
- Sample assessments
- Student data
- Detailed reflection
