ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS: In addition to Marshall University's requirements for admission, an applicant must have a bachelor's degree with an undergraduate grade point average (UGPA) of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale from a regionally accredited institution to be fully admitted. A student may be admitted provisionally with a minimum GPA of 2.5.

STUDENT REQUIREMENTS: All degree students follow a program Plan of Study and must maintain a cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) of 3.0. Failure by the student to return the signed Plan of Study within 30 days will automatically indicate acceptance of its terms. By signing this form, the student agrees that any applicable transfer credit may be accepted by the university and added to the student's permanent MU academic record. Note: Transfer credits may not be more than seven (7) years old at the time the student completes the MA.
