## CITI SYSTEM TRAININGS:

<p><b>Elements of Research Administration</b></p>	<p>This CITI module provides research administration professionals (sponsored program professionals and managers), principal investigators (PIs), and project directors with an overview of the different administrative components of sponsored programs. The Research Administration course as a whole will cover different areas of the sponsored programs administration profession, with five different modules:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Elements of Research Administration</li> <li>• Elements of Research Development</li> <li>• Elements of Preaward</li> <li>• Elements of Negotiation and Acceptance</li> <li>• Elements of PostAward</li> </ul>
<p><b>RCR Research</b></p>	<p>All researchers, staff and students of National Science Foundation (NSF) sponsored grants are required to complete an educational course on the Responsible Conduct in Research (RCR). The educational course utilized by Marshall University is the Collaborative Institutional Training Initiative (CITI). The steps for completing the educational requirements can also be found on the ORI educational website at <a href="#">ORI</a>. The course is broken down into approximately 25-minute modules so you can complete the modules as time permits. The steps for completing can be found <a href="#">here</a>.</p>
<p><b>PHS COI</b></p>	<p>PIs, Co-Is, and Co-PIs of US PHS (which includes the NIH) funded projects must complete the PHS COI course prior to award set up.
