Specific techniques

• Introducing improvisation:

- \circ The rhythm section is always improvising; use their parts as a guide for winds to make up riffs
- Use the melody or written figures from the chart to develop improvisational language
- Address the rhythm section first and keep everyone engaged:
 - \circ Everyone should learn the rhythm section roles and parts (handout)
 - Have winds do written or improvised parts on air and match the style of the rhythm section; this will build listening skills and make them conscious of improvement in their peers
