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Advance Registration Fall, 2018

As graduation moves slowly closer, April brings hopes and dreams of a bright future to our graduating seniors. However, all others have more work to do and the Fall 2018 semester is the next step. Advance registration will begin Monday, April 9th for seniors and be followed in succession by juniors, sophomores and freshmen.

The Advance Registration schedule is broken down by status, depending on credit-hours earned as of January 8, 2018. If your student has earned 90 hours before the first of the year, they will register as a senior (0-29 hours for freshmen, 30 hours for sophomores and 60 hours for juniors). This schedule helps our seniors to get into classes that might otherwise fill up.

Senior students will register first on April 9th. Juniors will follow on April 10th and 11th. Sophomores will need to seek their advisers before registering April 12th, 13th and 16th, as will freshmen before registering the 17th through the 20th. Unity Month Will Holland

Marshall University's dedication and commitment to diversity, equality and inclusion on campus and the surrounding community is being highlighted in a month-long celebration of differences and cooperation. April is Unity Month and departments all across campus will be hosting events and activities all month long (see full calendar below).

Will Holland, Director of Community Outreach and Volunteer Services is on the committee created to bring the dream of Unity Month to life.

"What we really wanted to do was create a calendar of events that would have a mass appeal to several different groups on campus," Holland said. "We wanted to highlight topics that have been in the news or needed more attention, but all regarding the concept of unity."

With events starting April 2nd, Holland said the goal is to creat an annual event that showcases the importance of differences and how working together shapes a better world.

"It seems each month has its own topic," he said. "February is African American History Month, March is Women's History Month, but this one looks to encompass all of them and show that unity among everyone creates a much more beautiful picture of prosperity."

Unity month will kickoff with the Unity March, April 4th from 3-5:00 p.m. The event will honor the legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. and the upcoming 50th anniversary of his assasination. The Unity March will begin on campus and will go to the A.D. Lewis Center on Hal Greer Blvd.

Other notable events will include Dreamers and Muslim Immigrants in the Trump Era panel discussion (April 9th), World Fusion Celebration (April 12th), and Safe Space Training (April 30th).

"We are trying to educate the publis about one another," Holland said. "My core belief is that the more exposed we are to diversity we are, the more likely we are to get along and work together, to get along. That's the ultimate goal. Let's learn about each other and find that we're not that different."

Above, you will find the Spring 2018 Final Exam Schedule. Here, we will look at the most common concerns and mistakes made on exam day.

- Exams ARE NOT held during regular class times. The above schedule is followed by all professors, but many times, our students show up at the regular class time to find they've missed their final exam. Remind them to look at the exam schedule and plan accordingly.
- Exams are two hours. Even if your student's class is one hour Monday, Wednesday and Friday, the Final Exam Schedule allows for test takers to do the exams in two hours. Encourage your young adults to take their time and read each section of the exam carefully.
- <u>Study Study!</u> Not all final exams are comprehensive, but many are! If your student has not delved back into the material from the first chapter or two, they may miss some great points opportunities.
- Not sure about your final or the material? Check the Syllabus! Every professor hands out (or offers online) a list of all information necessary for the course in their syllabus. Final exam dates, what will be on the exam, excused absences and more are on the syllabus. Encourage your student to check their sallabi dailey to ensure they're on the right path.
