

ABOUT MARSHALL UNIVERSITY





FORGET ABOUT LECTURE HALLS AND LONG-WINDED PRESENTATIONS -

At Marshall University School of Pharmacy, we do things a bit differently.

We subscribe to an Active Learning model that emphasizes interactivity, social awareness, and collaboration, providing a supportive environment for both our students and faculty.

What is Active Learning? It is comprised of dynamic, engaging assignments that promote analysis, synthesis, and evaluation of content. Students take what is learned from studying and apply it to realworld situations. Peer learning and team work to hand in hand, yielding better recollection and retention of concepts.

Active learning is face-to-face discussions, debates, case studies, games, role playing and simulations. It's a style of learning specifically designed for a new generation of students – those who are visual, hands-on, high-tech and social.



Our philosophy of Active Learning continues outside of the classroom and into our simulation environments. A mock hospital pharmacy, primary care office, and retail pharmacy areas provide hands-on application in a realworld environment. Students will earn multiple certifications through simulated work environments.

EARLY PRACTICE EXPERIENCES ARE THE CORNERSTONE OF MARSHALL'S ACTIVE LEARNING CURRICULUM.

Students are assigned to community and institutional pharmacy settings as early as their first year of pharmacy school.

Huntington's unique location also gives Marshall students the opportunity to have intern licenses in three states (Kentucky, Ohio, and West Virginia).

Additionally, advanced practice experiences in the fourth year can be completed at one of our many partner sites across the United States and internationally!

Marshall's four-year Pharm.D. can be completed as a 2+4, 3+4, or 4+4 program, finishing the necessary prerequisite coursework in as few as two years. NEW! 1+4 Accelerated Pathway for High-Achieving High School Students

Marshall University School of Pharmacy offers the nation's first 1+4 Accelerated Pathway for high school students aspiring to become pharmacists. This innovative program is tailored for high-achieving students with a passion for pharmacy, enabling them to fast-track their education and career. The 1+4 Accelerated Pathway allows exceptional high school students to complete one year of undergraduate coursework followed by direct entry into the Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) program, shortening the traditional timeline by a full year.

HOW TO APPLY

Marshall's School of Pharmacy takes a holistic approach to the admissions process. To be successfully considered for admission, applicants should meet the following requirements:

- 1. Completion of all Pre-Pharmacy Coursework at an accredited institution with a letter grade of C or higher prior to enrollment. An overall GPA of 2.5 and prerequisite GPA of 2.75 or higher on a 4.0 scale is recommended.
- 2. Submission of all required PharmCAS application documents three letters of recommendation, supplemental application and fee, by the indicated Early Decision or Regular Decision deadline.
- 3. Admission decisions are made after the satisfactory completion of a holistic interview process.

The Marshall University School of Pharmacy requires the completion of the listed courses prior to matriculation into the PharmD program. However, courses do not have to be completed prior to application submission and interview. Applicants must contact the Office of Student Affairs to request permission for any courses finishing after July 1.

- *The anatomy and physiology requirements can be fulfilled through a joint course, such as "Anatomy & Physiology I." However, students must take two semesters with labs to meet the requirement.
- If a course has a lab component listed, the lab is required to be completed.
