Marshall's Phi Kappa Phi Members Reach Out to the Community

- *Spring 2015 Book Drive*: Under the leadership of its student vice presidents (Shawn Cheeks, Bill Jones, Tuesday Moates-Simmons, and Danielle Ocheltree), Marshall's Chapter of Phi Kappa Phi partnered with the Honors College Student Association and the National Student Speech-Language-Hearing Association to hold a book drive to benefit St. John's House. An outreach of St. John's Episcopal Church, St. John's House has been operating in a government subsidized housing community in Huntington, WV for over 15 years. It is an after-school program that provides meals and activities geared toward supporting children's social, emotional, and educational needs. Two Marshall University speech-language pathology graduate students (Chelsea Schmidt and Lauren Johnson) coordinated its after-school activities in 2014-2015, including provision of supplementary literacy instruction for all children living in the housing community. We collected 302 books, 242 of which were children's books that went directly to the after-school program. The other 60 books were donated to St. John's Church Summer Reading Camp and the Marcum Terrace Family Resource Center.
- Literacy Grant: The National Honor Society of Phi Kappa Phi awarded Marshall's Local Chapter a Literacy Grant in the amount of \$2,500 to support St. John's House Tiny Talkers Program, a literacy program for preschool-aged children launched during the summer of 2015. www.marshall.edu/ucomm/2015/07/06/dr-mary-e-reynolds-awarded-phi-kappa-philiteracy-grant/.
