
Mission of Sigma Pi Sigma

Your History....


The Society of Physics Students was formed in **1968** with a constitution that combined its two "parent" organizations, The AIP Student Sections and the Sigma Pi Sigma honor society.

Marshall College was elevated to Marshall University in 1961 under the advisement of <u>Dr. Stewart H. Smith</u> (1904-1982), the seventh and longest serving Marshall University President in the history of the institution (from 1946-1968).

Our SPS external Donor is his son, **Dr. Frederick W. Smith**, who is happily enjoying retirement after 43 years of being an physics professor the City College of New York.


