Chair Tony Waugh called the meeting to order. Parliamentarian Becky Lusher verified there was a quorum.

Dr. Mukherjee – Provost

Enrollment

- Retention from first year to second year students is showing a growth of 7.4% this fall compared to last fall.
- o Transfer applications are up 13.3% and transfer deposits are up by 5%.
- Graduate applications are up 14%.
- Online and distance programs are up 10%.
- Metro deposits are up by 5%.
- o Out-of-state applications are down a little bit compared to last year.
- o Regular, first year applications are about even with last year.
- We are looking to have an increased number of dual credit/dual enrollment students.
- International students are about even, if not slightly less, compared to last year.

• Strategic Enrollment Management Council

- This newly formed "SEM" Council is in the process of creating an institute wide recruitment and retention structure and process.
- o These efforts will hopefully lead to an increased number of students in fall of 2023.

Accreditations

Several programs have been accredited in the last year.

- College of Business was accredited for five years.
- School of Pharmacy got a one year focused site visit, which means the accreditation team will come back for another visit next spring.
- Dietetics, Social Work, Communication Disorders, Engineering and Journalism were also accredited.

• Dean Searches

- o National searches, facilitated by AGB Search, will take place this fall for the following:
 - Dean of the College of Business
 - Dean of the College of Science
 - Dean of the College of Arts and Media
 - Dean of the School of Pharmacy

Mark Robison – CFO

- <u>AEI</u> payments will arrive on July 22nd.
- Finance is working on the audit and fiscal year close.
- Raises have been effective in the system since 7/2/22 and will appear on the 7/29/22 paycheck.

Bruce Felder – Human Resources

• <u>Junteenth</u> celebration that was hosted on campus had a great turnout as there were 260 seats filled and standing room only.

• Remote Work Policy

- Human Resources continues to encourage employees to work with their supervisors to come up with arrangements that suit the whole department and don't affect services to the students.
- The Administration is continuing the work on a policy for remote work with hopes to finalize it before the start of the fall semester.

• Vice President of Workforce and Economic Development

- A second round of interviews is taking place for this part of the President's strategic initiative to bring workforce and economic development together here at Marshall and to strengthen our contribution to the West Virginia economy.
- We want to create opportunities for our students while they are still in school, and not
 just after they graduate. We want to partner with local businesses and economic
 resources to understand what the need and hardwiring our students are getting and
 need via firsthand experience.

• Age and Gender Equity Assessment

• This work, which was a result of President Smith's listening tour, is near completion and once they go over the data there will be a report.

- President Smith thanked everyone who participated in this June event, which resulted in 451 people from the campus and community showed up to do 45 projects.

- Clarity around our vision, our mission and our strategy of how Marshall will be distinctive and show the world that we are an amazing asset not only to the state but to the world. Employees will receive surveys to give feedback.
 - West Virginia as a state retains only 19% of our college graduates, but Marshall retains 39%.

• Choose West Virginia Tour

- WVU President E. Gordon Gee, Speaker of the House Robert Hanshaw, Senate President Craig Blair, and Secretary of Economic Development Mitch Carmichael visited the Silicon Valley, New York, and Washington DC.
- The trip was to let others know who we are in West Virginia, what is happening here, and why they should choose West Virginia.
- Put together and showed a three minute sizzle reel prominently displaying Marshall and the amazing things happening in our State.
- Met with 39 CEO of major tech companies and energy companies in California including Intuit, Amazon, Facebook, Google, LinkedIn, and many others.
- Met with half a dozen investment bankers in Wall Street in New York.
- o Met with twelve international trade ambassadors in Washington, DC.
- Those met with were blown away as they did not know what was going on in West Virginia.
 - They came back with half a dozen leads on companies who either want to partner, provide internships and jobs, or open an office in West Virginia.
