Marshall University

- [Accessibility and Accommodations](#) - The Office of Accessibility and Accommodations provides the educational and physical accessibility support necessary for students to achieve their academic goals and promotes as much independence as possible on the part of the students with disabilities. *Located on the first floor of East Hall.*
- [Autism Training Center](#) - The mission of the West Virginia Autism Training Center is to provide support to individuals with autism spectrum disorders as they pursue a life of quality. *Located in Old Main 316.*
- [College Program for Students with Autism Spectrum Disorder](#) - This specialized program provides comprehensive support for students who have been accepted to Marshall University through a separate application process. Services are individualized to meet the students' unique needs and focus on building skills necessary to enter the workforce upon graduation. *Located in Old Main 307.*
- [Counseling Clinic](#) - Counseling Center offers professional therapeutic services that can assist students with mental health, academic, career, and personal needs. Counseling services are confidential and free for Marshall University students. Our primary goal is to support the mission of Marshall University and the Division of Student Affairs by providing support and assistance to develop students' personal growth, academic success, and mental health. *Located on the first floor of Prichard Hall.*
- [H.E.L.P Program](#) - A program dedicated to supporting students with learning disabilities, Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) and related disorders. Our mission is to provide personalized academic support and comprehensive resources to help students achieve their full potential. *Located in Myers Hall.*
- [MU Health Psychiatry](#) - Treatment for mood, thought and anxiety disorders, autism spectrum disorders, ADHD and disruptive behaviors and cognitive illnesses, including memory care and dementia are available at Marshall Psychiatry. Our outpatient psychiatrists include those specialty-trained and board-certified in adult psychiatry, child & adolescent psychiatry, as well as geriatric psychiatry. Medication management services are closely coordinated with a full staff of clinicians providing adjunctive psychotherapy. Doctoral level psychologists provide
