CHRISTMAS TRADITIONS FROM AROUND THE WORLD!

Mexico



In Mexico, Christmas is celebrated from December 12th to January 6th.

From December 16th to Christmas Eve, children often perform the 'Posada' processions or Posadas. Posada is Spanish for Inn or Lodging. There are nine Posadas. These celebrate the part of the Christmas story where Joseph and Mary looked for somewhere to stay. For the Posadas, the outside of houses are decorated with evergreens, moss and paper lanterns.

Japan



In Japan, Christmas is known as more of a time to spread happiness rather than a religious celebration. Christmas Eve is often celebrated more than Christmas Day. Christmas Eve is thought of as a romantic day, in which couples spend together and exchange presents. In many ways it resembles Valentine's Day celebrations in the UK and the USA. Young couples like to go for walks to look at the Christmas lights and have a romantic meal in a restaurant. Booking a table on Christmas Eve can be very difficult as it's so popular!

Fried chicken is often eaten on Christmas Day. It is the busiest time of year for restaurants such as KFC and people can place orders at their local fast food restaurants in advance! There was an advertising campaign by KFC in 1974 called 'Kentucky for Christmas!' (Kurisumasu ni wa kentakkii!) which was very successful and made KFC popular for Christmas!

Austria



In Austria, St Nicholas is often accompanied by the Krampus. He is a big horned monster clothed in rags and carries chains. He's meant to punish children who have been bad!

India



In India, Father Christmas or Santa Claus delivers presents to children from a horse and cart.

Compared to other religious festivals, Christmas is quite a small festival in India, due to the number of people who are Christians (about 2.3%) compared to people who belong to other religions. Having said this, the population of India is over 1 Billion, so there are over 25 million Christians in India!

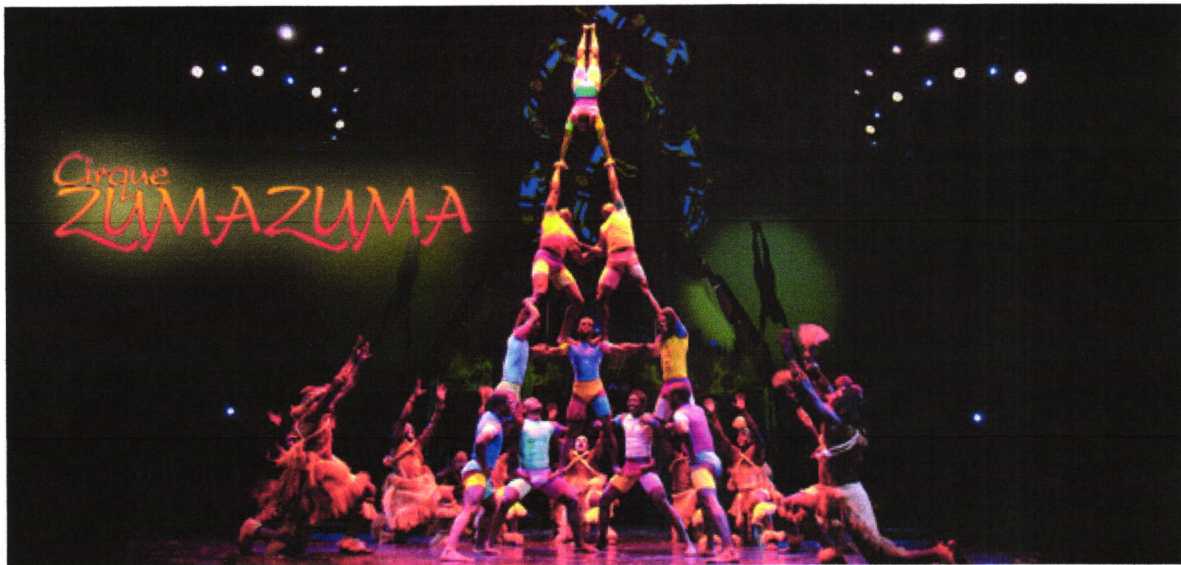

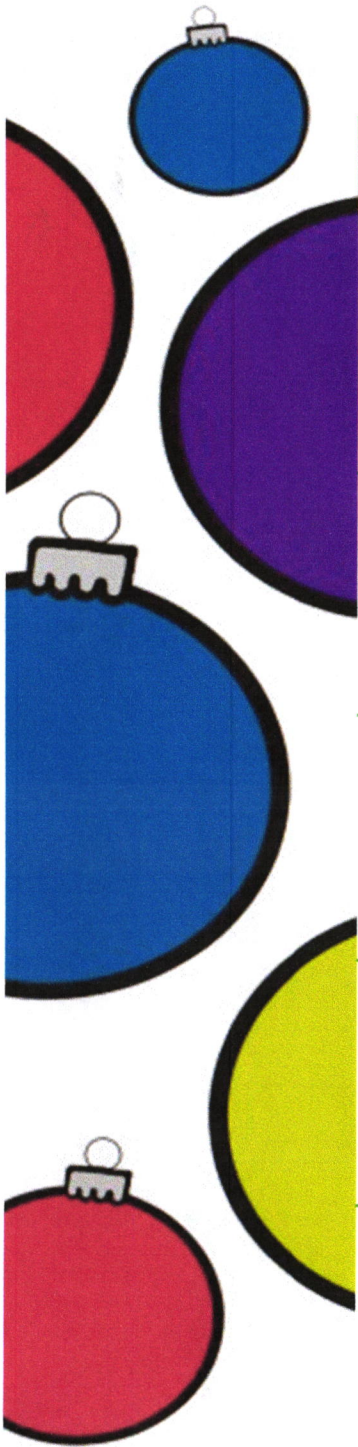
