

YEAGER SENIOR PROJECT



The capstone of the Yeager program is required senior project. The senior project is the culmination of each Scholar's undergraduate work. It can be a research paper or a creative work completed under the guidance of a faculty member and presented to the university community at the end of the senior year. This project extends beyond one class or one assignment and should display the depth and breadth of knowledge and ability each student has gained while a student at Marshall University.

It is the responsibility of the student to form a Yeager Senior Project Committee and keep that committee informed of the scope, methodology, and progress of both the research and final project. The committee includes the Dean of the Honors College and should include at least one faculty member at Marshall. Other members may be additional faculty members or experts in their respective fields. Four total members, including the dean, are recommended. The following signature form must be submitted with the final project, indicating that each member of the committee believes the student has presented sound and original academic work.

Failure to submit a senior project prevents the student from both participation in Yeager Medallion Ceremony and graduation as a Yeager Scholar.

Note: Students who wish to use a Shadowing capstone as their Yeager senior project must obtain prior approval from both the Director of the Yeager program and the Instructor-On-Record for the Shadowing course.
